The Puppy will be going home no earlier than 12 weeks old. By that time, the Puppy will have had three shots, a minimum of three deworms, will be microchipped and has been seen by a vet to ensure the Puppy has a clean bill of health (which includes, but is not limited to physical appearance, including patellas and hips, heart sounds, organ placement, eyes, ears, mouth/bite, temperature). This bill of health provides the Adopter with a one-year Health Warranty on hereditary or congenital issues for the Puppy (which includes, but is not limited to issues such as portosystemic shunts, severe luxating patella requiring surgery, retinal atrophy and corneal dystrophy leading to juvenile onset blindness). In the case of issues arising before the one year is up, Rainbow Amour will take the puppy back and offer a replacement puppy to the Adopter (replacement time is subject to availability). All expenses associated with the return of the Puppy are the responsibility of the Adopter. If the Adopter prefers to keep the Puppy after being diagnosed with a hereditary or congenital issue, no replacement puppy is offered and all related expenses are the responsibility of the Adopter.

In the case of the death of the Puppy during the duration of the Health Warranty, an autopsy and lab report must be performed to determine the cause of death. This is to be done by a licensed veterinarian of Rainbow Amour's choosing. If it is found that the Puppy has died due to a hereditary or congenital issue, Rainbow



Amour will cover the cost of the autopsy and offer a replacement puppy to the Adopter (replacement time is subject to availability). If it is found that the Puppy was abused in any way, the cost of the autopsy is to be covered by the Adopter and no replacement puppy is offered.

In order to keep the one-year health warranty, the Adopter must take the Puppy for a complete health checkup to a vet of their choosing, at their own expense, within the first week after the Puppy is taken home. Results of the health checkup must be sent back to Rainbow Amour shortly after being completed. Should this not be done, the one-year warranty is void.

Spay/Neuter of the Puppy must be completed before 12 months of age in order to receive the Puppy's registration papers. Proof of spay/neuter must be sent back to Rainbow Amour shortly after being completed.

Should the Adopter be unable or unwilling to care for the Puppy during its lifetime for any reason whatsoever, Rainbow Amour is to be notified and we will take the Puppy back, no questions asked. The Adopter is not to place the Puppy in a home of their choosing, nor bring the Puppy to a shelter/pound.

Rainbow Amour is not responsible for any medical expenses that arise once the Adopter has picked up the Puppy (unless they are considered hereditary or congenital). There is no guarantee on size, coat quality, breeding quality or disposition.

During the transition period of going to a new home, the Puppy may exhibit temporary signs of illness due to stress that can include, but are not limited to, sneezing, runny nose, watery eyes, loss of appetite, diarrhea, vomiting and constipation. The Adopter may choose to use bottled water to lower the chances of diarrhea or vomiting. To help reduce stress, Rainbow Amour will provide the Adopter with a small amount of food to give the Adopter time to either purchase more of the same food, or to give the Adopter time to transition the Puppy to another type of food. If the Adopter chooses to transition the Puppy off of the food it has been raised on, transition should be done very slowly (over 1-2 weeks) to avoid issues such as diarrhea and vomiting.

Measures should be taken to avoid stressing the Puppy for the first few days. This includes, but is not limited to avoiding: long periods of rough play, long walks or long periods of crying. The first week should be spent calmly and at home, bonding with the Puppy. The Adopter can also reduce stress by slowly introducing the Puppy to the household, strangers, children and other animals.

This signed agreement voids any terms, arrangements, modifications, promises, warranties or guarantees made or understood by either party that are not expressed within this written agreement.

By signing, the Adopter states that they have read this Puppy Adoption Agreement and acknowledges that they understand this agreement thoroughly.
